

Public Notice: Beach Restoration Project

Residents of Mexico Beach are advised that the Beach Restoration Project is underway. As part of this project, there will be 24-hour construction activities, including beach closures and restricted access to certain areas.

The construction will involve the creation of a dune-only component on the west end of the beach and a dune and beach component starting around 34th street, extending to the Gulf County line. The beach will be extended approximately 175 feet from the seaward toe of the proposed dune.

Please be aware of the following:

- 24-hour construction: Construction activities, including use of heavy machinery, will take place around the clock, and residents can expect noise and disruptions during this time.
- Moving beach closures: Certain areas of the beach will be closed to the public due to construction, and these closures will be moving as the project progresses.
- Worker parking: Construction workers will be parking in designated areas on 37th, and residents
 are asked to respect these parking restrictions to ensure the safe and efficient completion of the
 project.
- Boat ramp parking area: The northeastern corner of the parking area will be used to store oversized materials from the dredging operation.
- Underwater pipeline: An underwater pipeline will run between the beach and the dredging area approximately 2.65 miles into the Gulf.

The project is expected to start with equipment staging on January 6th, 2025 and be completed by April 15th, 2025. Residents are encouraged to stay informed about the project's progress and any updates on construction schedules and beach closures through the City of Mexico Beach's official website and social media channels.
