ORDINANCE NO. 11

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES, SCOOTERS, MOTOR-BIKES, AND OTHER POWER OPERATED VEHICLES WITHIN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA; PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF SAID VEHICLES IN CERTAIN AREAS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND DECLARING THE PASSAGE OF SAID ORDINANCE TO BE AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Mexico Beach is of the opinion that the immediate enactment of this ordinance is required for the protection and preservation of the peace, safety, health and prosperity of the Town and its inhabitants, Now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful to operate any pwder-driven motor vehicle, scooter, cycle, motor-bike, racer or other vehicular devices which may be operated by power, either gas, steam, diesel, electric, or other power, on the beaches of the Town of Mexico Beach.

SECTION 2. The beaches of the Town of Mexico Beach are hereby defined as

All lands lying between U.S. Highway 98 and the Gulf of Mexico extending from the South Town Limit of the Town of Mexico Beach, Florida, to the Southeast boundary line of Unit No. 1, Mexico Beach Subdivision, together with all lands lying between the mean low water mark of the Gulf of Mexico and the Southwest property line of Units Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 5 and 7, Mexico Beach Subdivision.

SECTION 3. Any person found guilty of the violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not in excess of \$100.00 or a jail sentence no exceeding 10 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect May 6, 1969.

This Ordinance INTRODUCED at a regular meeting of the Town Council on the 6th day of May, A.D. 1969, and ADOPTED by the Town Council on the 6th day of May, A.D. 1969, as an emergency ordinance.
