

ORDINANCE NO. 186

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LIVESTOCK ON PUBLIC BEACHES;
PROVIDING A DEFINITION OF LIVESTOCK; PROVIDING
PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN
CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mexico Beach, Florida,
has determined that it is in the best interests of the health, welfare
and safety of the people of the City of Mexico Beach that this ordinance
be enacted, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. For the purposes of this ordinance the term "head
of livestock" shall mean any horse, cow, hog or other grazing animal.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to bring, ride
or transport any head of livestock onto the public beaches of Mexico
Beach, Florida.


Section 3. Violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a
misdemeanor and shall be punishable by imprisonment of a period not to
exceed sixty (60) days or a fine not to exceed \$500.00 or both.

Section 4. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby
repealed.


Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by
