ORDINANCE NO. 204

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING CERTAIN USER FEE CHARGES SPECIFICALLY IMPOSED FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING INCREASED SANITATION TIPPING FEES, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Mexico Beach incurs certain expenses derived from City refuse disposal in the form of tipping fees and

WHEREAS, the County of Bay, State of Florida,

by virtue of passing an ordinance doubling the current monetary rate charged for tipping fee services, has caused the City of Mexico Beach to require additional funds for said services, therefore,

¹ BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That a user fee is hereby established for the explicit purpose of funding increased refuse tipping fees imposed by the County of Bay and levying such increases to each individual household or commercial enterprise who maintains on City record an active water account with the City of Mexico Beach. User fee categories and charges will be on file in the City Hall.

<u>Section 2</u>: That billing for said user fee will be annotated on the City of Mexico Beach monthly water usage statements.

Section 3: That it shall be the duty of the Mexico Beach Water Department to collect said user fee and remit to the City on or before the 15th day of each month all such fees collected during the preceding calendar month. It shall be the responsibility of the Water Department to collect the fee hereby levied in connection with any sale of water service. If any purchaser of water service shall fail, neglect or refuse to pay said user fee to the collector of . said fee, the City of Mexico Beach is hereby vested with the right to discontinue immediately further water service to the purchaser until the user fee has been paid in full.

Section 4: That the collector of the user fee shall keep complete records showing all fees collected, price being charged monthly for said service being provided, and the date of payment thereof and the records shall, at all reasonable times, be open for inspection by duly authorized agents of the City during business hours on all business days, and said agents shall have authority to make such transcripts thereof as may be necessary.

<u>Section 5</u>: That any person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned for not more than sixty (60) days or both such fine and imprisonment, and each and every violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute separate offenses.

<u>Section 6</u>: That if any section, portion or clause of this ordinance for any reason shall be held invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality

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shall not affect or invalidate the remaining sections or provisions.

<u>Section 7</u>: That the funds accruing to the City of Mexico Beach from the user fee mentioned herein shall be dedicated solely for the purpose of sanitation tipping fees.

<u>Section</u> 8: That this ordinance shall take effect as prescribed by law.

SANITATION

User Fee Cost Factors

<u>Summer</u> <u>Season</u> (May Through September)

Definitions:

(1) <u>Basic Factor</u> - Lowest cost assigned to a residential unit. This factor is a multiplier used to compute the basic billing element for each residential unit or commercial enterprise.

This unit of billing is predicated on those residential units located on the north side of U.S. Hwy. 98, since their sanitation service is based on two (2) weekly collections.

Billing is based on the lowest basic factor which generates garbage and is assigned a factor of X 1.

(2) South Side Residential Cost Factor

This factor is derived by multiplying the basic factor by 1.5, since these residences receive three weekly garbage collections during the summer season.

(3) Multiple Dwellings - North Side

A basic factor of 1 X the number of dwelling units.

(4) Multiple Dwellings - South Side

A basic factor of 1 X the number of dwelling units X 1.5.

(5) Commercial Establishment Cost Factor

All commercial establishments are assigned a cost factor of 3 X the basic factor. Exceptions: a. Real Estate Offices are assigned a basic cost factor
 of X 1.

b. Laundromats are assigned a basic cost factor of X 2.

- c. Churches are assigned a basic cost factor of X 1.
- d. Governmental agencies are assigned a cost factor of "O".

e. Civic enterprises (Chamber of Commerce, etc.) are assigned a cost factor of X 1.

(6) Mobile Home Park Cost Factor

Based on the number of available homesites, a 75% occupancy rate X the basic factor is assigned.

Example: 20 Homesites X 75% =

15 X basic factor X 1 = 15 basic factors (7) <u>Hotel/Motel Cost Factors</u>

Divided into 3 categories:

a. Large - 16 units and above (X 5 basic factor)

b. Medium - 8 through 15 units (X 4 basic factor)

c. Small - 1 through 7 units (X 3 basic factor) Example: Medium motel = X 4 basic factor X 1.5 =

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6 basic factors. (1.5 indicates 3 garbage

collections per week - summer season)

Summary:

All factors for each category will be grossed and all category totals summed to derive the grand total of all factors. This grand total is divided into the total cost for tipping fees for the City. The resulting cost represents the basic cost factor for billing purposes.

Attachment 1

SANITATION User Fee Cost Factors

(May Through September)

Definitions:

(1) <u>Basic Factor</u> - Lowest cost assigned to a residential unit. This factor is a multiplier used to compute the basic billing element for each residential unit or commercial enterprise.

This unit of billing is predicated on those residential units located on the north side of U.S. Hwy. 98, since their sanitation service is based on two (2) weekly collections.

Billing is based on the lowest basic factor which generates garbage and is assigned a factor of X 1.

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This factor is derived by multiplying the basic factor by 1.5, since these residences receive three weekly garbage collections during the summer season.

(3) Multiple Dwellings - North Side

A basic factor of 1 X the number of dwelling units.

(4) <u>Multiple Dwellings - South Side</u>

A basic factor of 1 X the number of dwelling units X 1.5.

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c. Small - l through 7 units (X 3 basic factor)
Example: Medium motel = X 4 basic factor X 1.5 =

6 basic factors. (1.5 indicates 3 garbage

collections per week - summer season)

Summary:

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All factors for each category will be grossed and all category totals summed to derive the grand total of all factors. This grand total is divided into the total cost for sanitation fees for the City. The resulting cost represents the basic cost factor for billing purposes.

Attachment 2

SANITATION <u>User Fee Cost Factors</u> (October Through April)

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All basic factors remain in force with the exception of Paragraph 2 and 4 of Attachment 1. During the winter season this cost factor is reduced to a basic factor of 1, since these residences and multiple dwellings will only receive 2 weekly garbage collections.
