AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE LEVY OF TAXES IN THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA, FOR THE TAX YEAR 1972, LEVYING AN AD VALOREM TAX OF 3 MILLS ON ALL REAL PROPERTY WITHIN SAID TOWN, WHICH IS NOT EXEMPT UNDER LAW, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE ORDINARY AND REGULAR REQUIREMENTS OF THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1972/1973; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND DECLARING SAID ORDINANCE TO BE AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Mexico Beach is of the opinion that it is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of the peace, safety, health and property of the Town and its inhabitants, and to provide for the usual daily operation of the Town and its Departments, that this Ordinance be enacted and take effect immediately, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section I. There is hereby levied and assessed upon all real property within the corporate limits of the Town of Mexico Beach, Florida, not exempt from taxation by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Florida, an ad valorem tax for the year 1972 of three (3) mills upon the dollar of the assessed valuation for the purpose of providing funds for the ordinary and regular purposes of the Town of Mexico Beach, Florida, for the fiscal year 1972/73, said valuation to be based upon the assessment roll of Bay County, Florida.

INTRODUCED at a regular meeting of the Town Council on the lith Day of July, A.D. 1972, and ADOPTED by the Town Council on the lith day of July, A.D. 1972, as an emergency Ordinance.
