

ORDINANCE NO. 60

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLACEMENT OF MOBILE HOMES OR TRAILERS WITHIN THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, PROVIDING PENALTIES, SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND DECLARING PASSAGE OF SAID ORDINANCE TO BE AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Mexico Beach is of the opinion that the immediate enactment of this ordinance is required for the protection and preservation of the peace, safety, health and prosperity of the Town and its inhabitants, Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. It is hereby declared to be unlawful to place a mobile home or trailer, whether used for residential or commercial purposes, on any platted block within the municipal limits of the Town of Mexico Beach, unless a trailer or mobile home was already situated on said block prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall supplement the provisions and regulations of the Southern Building Code.

SECTION 3. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$200.00 or ten days in jail, or both, for each day the violation continues in existence.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

INTRODUCED at a regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Mexico Beach on the 24th day of September, 1975, and ADOPTED by the Town Council on the 24th day of September, 1975, as an emergency ordinance.
