ORDINANCE 782

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA EXTENDING THE WAIVER OF THE REQUIREMENT FOR AN UPLAND BUSINESS IN ORDER TO OPERATE A BEACH VENDING BUSINESS AS CONTAINED IN SECTION 5 (3) OF ORDINANCE 740 FOR CERTAIN ALREADY QUALFIED BUSINESSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the city of Mexico Beach "City" adopted Ordinance 740, which among other things extended the waiver provided to certain business to operate beach vending business without a direct upland business established by the adoption of Resolution 2019-6 for the years 2020 and 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that more time is needed for those businesses to reestablish the direct upland business and it is in the best interests of the City's residents and visitors for the waiver extended by Ordinance 740 to be extended again: and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA:

- 1. The waiver contained in Ordinance 740 waving Section 5 (3) of said ordinance for the businesses located at the following addresses,
 - a. 719 US HWY 98
 - b. 903 US HWY 98
 - c. 1701 US HWY 98
 - d. 2105 US HWY 98

shall be extended an additional two years expiring December 31, 2023.

- 2. All other provisions of Ordinance 740 shall remain in full force and affect and not be changed by this ordinance
- 3. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage pursuant to Florida Law
