## **RESOLUTION 2015-10**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MEXICO BEACH, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE CITY APPLYING FOR FDEP BEACH EROSION CONTROL PROGRAM FUNDING TO MEET THE GOALS OF THE MEXICO BEACH MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, the City of Mexico Beach desires to improve the existing sand bypass system to provide a more efficient process that would assist with the City's renourishment efforts and reduce the impacts to the City's annual budget; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mexico Beach desires to permit and implement a "vehicular sand bypass" system or other approved method of transporting sand to the critically eroded sections of Mexico Beach's beach in addition to the currently operational bypassing system; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mexico Beach desires to permit, design and construct improvements to the east and west canal jetty system to protect the canal from sedimentation and to reduce annual maintenance costs; and

WHEREAS, the FDEP permit for the current sand bypass system must be amended to encompass the vehicular sand bypass option; so

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEXICO BEACH, that the City of Mexico Beach fully supports the improvement of the existing sand bypass system, vehicular sand bypass option and the design and permitting of the improvements to the east and west jetties, the City is willing to serve as the local sponsor for this project. By way of this resolution, the City of Mexico Beach also pledges to fund the local cost share or this project utilizing budgeted moneys from the general fund.
