

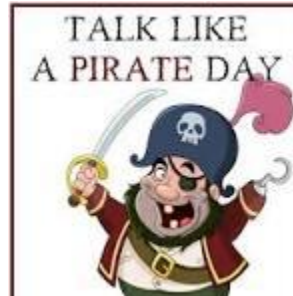

Pedestrian Bike Trail

I attended a meeting of municipal representatives for the Bay County TPO Pedestrian Bike Trail. We were shown how to navigate the interactive map. It can be accessed by going to: www.ecrc.org/BayPedBikeTrails2025. Once you get to the website, scroll down and click on view project map. I did make a note that the trail on 15th Street is on the west/north side to reflect our pedestrian bridge.

Boat ramp

Drawings are under final QA/QC review. Anchor working on revised Grant Agreement and Invitation to Bid package.

15th Street Pedestrian Bridge

Bridge Brothers is working on material procurement which will set the delivery schedule; they will be in touch with a fabrication/delivery date (probably Feb/March). Revised foundation drawings are being finalized by structural engineer.

Public Works Water Tank Aeration System

Cyber Electric sent quote for mixer system, CROM has reviewed and provided feedback and is requesting additional information regarding Cyber Electric's quote. Anchor will put letter together for City to include an updated quote from Cyber.

Nickle Creek

Anchor is working on proposal. A few questions were sent to Garrett regarding the area lift stations, existing sewer mains, etc.

Cul-de-sac on Canal Parkway

Anchor is working on options letter for the Council to review.

Amphitheater

BGN's design team is finalizing their structural (foundation) and electrical drawings (no change from last week). Looking at January delivery.

Nanook and 14th Street Lift Stations

Anchor waiting on electrical quote from Duke Energy. Contractor waiting on lift station lid before resuming work on 14th Street lift station.



Nanook – Mainline received a quote for pump but is still waiting for the submittals. They will send all the information as soon as they have it.

HWY 98 and 4th Street

Final addendum released. Bids to be opened at 2:00 on Friday September 19.

CASUNA & Ocean Plantation

Anchor received construction drawings for each of the subdivisions, which was needed by Anchor to finish up their task order for the review of the streets and sidewalks in OP and sidewalks in CASUNA.

Bypass Pumps Installation

Anchor has crafted a task order to oversee the installation of the pumps on behalf of the city. On the agenda for September 23rd Council meeting.

Old Boat Ramp and Marina Repair

The old boat ramp off Miramar Drive had to be repaired this week. An area washed out causing a hole. Public Works filled it with concrete. Also a collapse in the surface near the corner by the Welcome Center had to be filled as well.

Occupational Permits

Renewals were sent out this week.

City Fuel Pumps

Temporary pumps are working. We await delivery of the permanent pumps and installation.

Boat Dock

The dock was installed this week. Lt. Williams tested it out and gave it a thumbs up.
